

CANADIAN PROVINCES NAME GAME

GRADES: 3-6

FORMATION: Standing in their own personal space

EQUIPMENT: Questions/ Answers (provided with activity)

LEARNING OUTCOMES: SOCIAL STUDIES, Listening skills

SAFETY CONSIDERATIONS: Remind participants to be cautious when moving and to be aware of the personal space of others. Check that the participants have enough space to perform the activities safely.

RULES/DIRECTIONS:

Print out the Province and Territories cards along with the questions listed below or use any of your own that you may be learning. To play the game you simply spread the cards face-up on the floor.

Teacher reads aloud the first question. The student then stands on (or holds up high) what the province they think is the right answer. You can split the class up into two teams and have 1 person from each team go at a time or have the whole class on the same team and 1 student go per round and keep score. After each round, Have the class do so many reps of any exercise move. Keep score to see how many points your class gets (1 pt for each right answer).

Sample Exercises-

Toe touches, Bicep Curls, Knee Lifts, Jumping Jacks, Sit Ups, Push Ups, Heel Jacks, Skipping, Knee Touches, Bicep Curls/Heel Jacks, Squats, Lunges, Shoulder Presses, Jumps to the Sky, Twist, Calf Raises, Run On The Spot, Kicks, Squat Jumps.
