

## **"SUBJECT" REVIEW BASKETBALL**

For a review of concepts in a particular course, play an in class "basketball game" that requires students to give correct answers in order to get chances to shoot. The basket could be a bucket on top of a desk. The objects to shoot could be bean bags or small, no bounce, foam balls. Mark off three distinct shooting lines on the floor valued as a one point line, a two point line, and a three point line.

To play, the teacher (or students) create a series of questions related to a particular topic in the curriculum. The teacher goes back and forth between the teams with the questions. When a team gets the answer correct, the team is awarded one point plus they get an opportunity to shoot at the basket. (Note: Tell the students at the start of the game that you will announce a shooting time after every 10 - 20 questions so that you don't have to stop after every question to shoot.) When teams go to shoot, the students can select the line from which they want to shoot. Everyone has to shoot once before any player gets a chance to shoot a second time.
